

## **Paternoster School Pupil Premium**

The pupil premium was introduced from April 2011.

It is allocated to:

- pupils who are currently known to be eligible for free school meals (or those who have been eligible during the previous six years, known as 'Ever 6')
- pupils who have been 'looked after' continuously for more than six months
- pupils who are children of service personnel

Schools may spend the pupil premium as they feel appropriate.

At Paternoster we are committed to supporting pupils and their families.

The pupil premium supports pupils' developments and achievements in the following areas:

- communication skills
- independence, self esteem and confidence
- personal and social skills, including behaviour

The pupil premium allocation of £3870 was spent on additional staffing in classes and contributed to the parent support worker salary and music therapy provision.

Analysis of pupil progress in July 2012 shows pupils receiving pupil premium funding make good progress, which is comparable to other groups of pupils in the school. Eight of the nine pupils exceeded their targets in one or more areas.

The Pupil Premium allocation of £7450 was spent on additional staffing in classes, contributed to the parent support worker salary, music therapy provision and purchase of an iPad.

Analysis of pupil progress in July 2013 shows pupils receiving pupil premium funding make good or outstanding progress, which was comparable to other groups of pupils. In English and Maths the majority of pupils achieved or exceeded their targets.

The pupil premium allocation of £9300 will be spent on additional staffing in classes, contribution to the parent support worker salary and additional resources.

The progress of pupils receiving pupil premium funding will be analysed in July 2014 at the end of the academic year.
